

“Ecological and environmental protection education in a European context!”

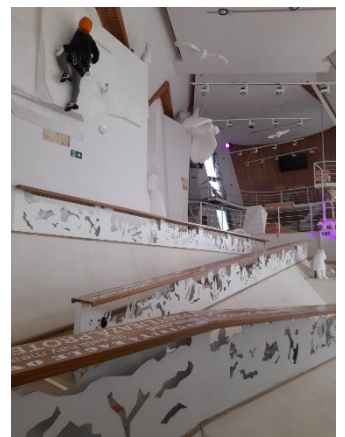
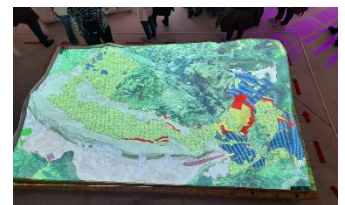
Erasmus+

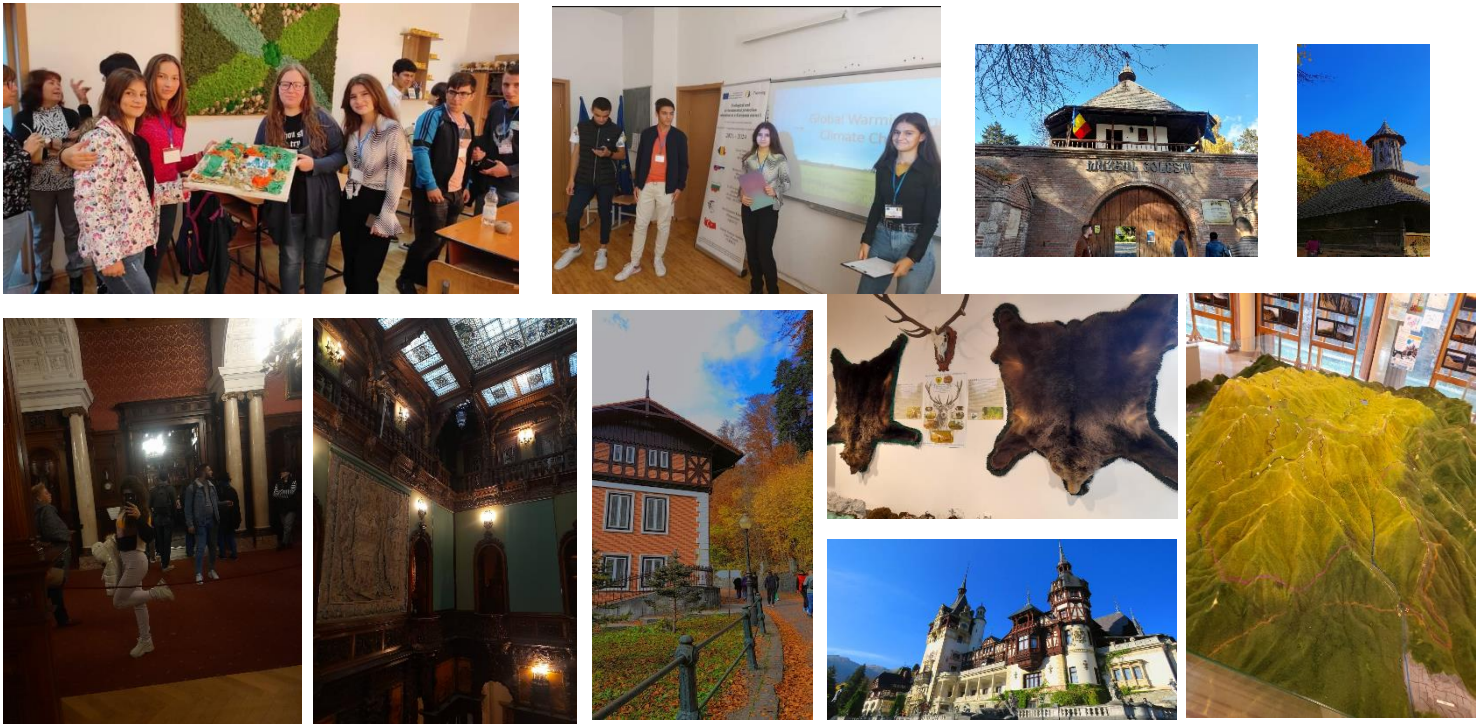
